a. E-mail Display: Government civilians have the option to use the abbreviation "Civ" on their e-mail display instead of a pay grade. Civilians requesting the change should contact their unit Workgroup Manager (WM). (30SCS/SCB, 6-3078)

b. VEPDL Simplification: When looking for 14AF or 30SW documents in a particular series, you are now able to see not only the instructions for that series, but supplements, manuals, handbooks, pamphlets, and visual aids. Current links to the supplements, through the supplements link, will eventually be removed and only accessible through the series. To find a document you only need to know if it is written by 14AF or 30SW, and which series it pertains to, to locate it. (30SCS/SCSP, 6-7892)

c. Records Management (RM) Via CBT On The VEPDL: Effective immediately, personnel who elect to receive RM training at their desk over the VEPDL must have a RM appointment memorandum generated and sent to the Office of Base Records Management (Bldg 6525, Rooms B-31 & B-33) before they can receive their AF 1256, Certificate of Training. Accountability is key in records management. (30SCS/SCBR-WROCI, 6-4212/6-0682)

d. Subdivisions To The ZZZ³ Power: Avoid limitless file plan subdivisions. Too many subdivisions will do nothing but cause confusion/problems for records custodians. If you have three letter subdivisions e.g., AAA or ZZZ many of those files should be filed with their own Table and Rule. The triple digit breakout could become an illegal file and have the wrong disposition therefore being destroyed prematurely or being staged at some point (and not ever being disposed of as required). Bottom line: The Records Manager has the authority to exercise discretion. (30SCS/SCBR-WROCI, 6-4212)

e. Attention Unit Personal Wireless Communication System (PWCS) Managers: Effective immediately the base Land Mobile Radio (LMR) office will be closed every Wednesday. Please schedule the drop-off and pick-up of your equipment accordingly. (30SCS/SCMMD-L, 6-9927)

When shipping classified items, they must be processed through Cargo Movement, Bldg 5500 Bay B, unless other arrangements have been made. Cargo Movement must be advised on the classification level. This change is effective immediately. To reach the BEST telephone automated system dial 1-800-616-3775. As you enter the system you'll hear "Welcome to the Air Force Customer Service Center". Press 2 for Air Force serviced civilian employee, then 2 for BEST benefits and entitlements services. You'll hear several clicks and a short period of silence - don't hang up. You'll hear "Welcome to the Air Force Personnel Center", press 2 to access the Benefits and Entitlements service system, then press 1 for current Air Force-serviced employee, then press 1 again to enter your social security number and PIN or press 2 if you have forgotten your PIN. Once you have cleared the PIN and telephone verification modules, you'll be at the main menu where you will select the program area related to your question.
