This is very important to you, because not only will it allow you opportune time to schedule the appointments at your convenience, but you will also find out far enough in advance what your actual clearance responsibilities will be so you will not be caught by any surprises at the last minute. You will have the necessary lead-time to properly prepare your assigned unit for the final clearance appointment thus alleviating unnecessary stress for you and your family. Remember summer is the peak season for military moves. We are short one inspector so inspection slots are at a premium so it is critical that you contact the Housing Office as soon as you know you will be departing the area. Safety Reminders: The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration: "**Share the Road!**" Motorists: Slow down and pay attention when traveling in neighborhoods and near parks, schools and playgrounds. Watch for kids at play - children on foot and on bikes are unpredictable, often act before thinking, and may dart out into traffic without warning. Remember that the longer daytime hours mean that children may be outside playing later than usual. Watch out for pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorcyclists. They're not as easy to see as a car or truck, and you are likely to be looking for other cars. Respect them and share the road. Bicyclists and Motorcyclists: See and be seen--dress to be seen. **Tidbits on Aggressive Driving** -- More than 60 percent of drivers believe that unsafe driving by others was a major personal threat to them and to their families. -- Aggressive drivers are more likely to speed, tailgate, fail to yield, weave in-and-out of traffic, pass on the right, make improper and unsafe lane changes, and run STOP signs and red lights. b. Pay Adjustments: Civilian employees may be noticing some differences in their pay. In March the President signed a pay adjustment bill that added 1.66% to GS Locality Pay for this area which was retroactive back to 12 Jan 03. FWS employees had the pay cap adjusted, and that change was retroactive back to 17 Nov 02. The pay adjustments were processed beginning the end of April and continuing through all of May. Employees will see a change in their adjusted basic pay, and will also have a lump sum for the retroactive portion. Unfortunately, we cannot track when the adjustment occurred for each employee. Some were processed automatically and others required a manual correction to the pay. If you have not seen an adjustment by the first pay check in July, then you need to contact your servicing staffing specialist at VAFB at extension 6-3641 to find out why. Another one time adjustment many employees will see this month is for performance awards. We believe that all performance awards, both cash and time off, have processed. Cash awards are effective 1 Jun 03 and should be paid out in the paycheck of 20 Jun 03. (30MSS/DPC, 65846)

c. Vacancy Announcements: Because of the retroactive pay adjustments and processing requirements, much of the staff at AFPC has been working special assignments. Locally we have taken on some of the workload that is typically done at AFPC including writing job vacancy announcements. Because there has been a slowdown in the work done at AFPC and they are now trying to get over a backlog, they may be posting job vacancy announcements outside the normal Friday cycle. All jobs will be posted for a minimum of one week, but may start on a day other than Friday. - a. Allan Hancock College Offers Additional Summer Math Class:** An algebra class (MATH 131, College Algebra) has been added to the summer credit classes offered by Allan Hancock College. This three-unit, eight-week class (ticket # 0261) will meet Monday through Thursday from 11:30 a.m. to 1:45 p.m. beginning June 16 at the college's Vandenberg AFB Center located at 14003 Wyoming Avenue. This math class, taught by Mr. Michael Pease, meets Community College of the Air Force (CCAF) requirements. Those interested in taking the MATH 131 class, or any of the other summer credit classes, may need to attend a START (Student Testing, Advising, Retention and Transition) session prior to registration. Students can meet their START requirement in one of two ways. The standard way is to take a computerized START test offered at either the

Santa Maria campus or the Lompoc Valley Center. START sessions are offered during the week and on Saturdays at both locations. Specific dates and times of assessment are posted on the START page on the Allan Hancock College Web site at www.hancockcollege.edu, click on "Testing" in the Quick Links box and press "Go." The second option is to pick up a self-assessment packet from the Allan Hancock College office on VAFB or from the counseling office at the Lompoc Valley Center or the Santa Maria campus. The student should arrive one hour early on the first day of class with the self-assessment package completed. Counselors and the instructor will be there to help the students analyze their self-assessment to determine proper placement. The students may complete the enrollment process that day. **Please note that pre-enrollment is not available to students who choose the self-assessment START option.** (5-5915) **This is an Allan Hancock College Modified Self-Assessment Pilot Project.** This pilot project is only open to students intending to enroll in one specific section of Math 131 (ticket #0261) being offered this summer at VAFB. There are two prerequisites for enrolling in College Algebra; a college level geometry class or one year of high school geometry with a grade of "C" or better, AND a college level intermediate algebra course. For the purpose of this pilot project, Allan Hancock College will be accepting the word of the student that the prerequisites have been met for College Algebra, or that those skills have been achieved in another fashion. If the student withdraws from this pilot project class, or is not successful with a grade of "C" or better, the student will be required to follow the regular placement process. (30MSS/DPHS, 5-5915)

b. Community College of the Air Force (CCAF) Information: CCAF graduates from the spring 2003 graduating class may pick up their graduation photos at the Base Education Office. d. College Level Examination Program (CLEP) Test Withdrawal Schedule: Attention all Community College of the Air Force (CCAF) and continuing education students. CLEP paper based exams are being incrementally withdrawn as DANTES (Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support) begins the transition to computer based CLEP testing. (DANTES Subject Standardized Test (DSST) exams will not be affected at this time.) Until DOD acquires the infrastructure to support computer based testing, the tests listed below will not be available at the Base Education Center after the withdrawal date. In the interim, Cuesta College in San Luis Obispo offers computer based CLEP testing, exams can be taken there as they become unavailable at Vandenberg AFB. We will keep you informed of additional titles and withdrawal dates as they are announced. CLEP and DSST exams can be taken at the Base Education Center Monday and Wednesday at 1300 hours or Tuesday and Thursday at 0800 hours. There is no testing on Friday. Due to limited seating in the Testing Room, we recommend you call 5-5904 in advance to reserve a slot for one of these sessions. The following CLEP subjects will no longer be available via paper based testing as of 30 Jun 03: CLEP General Humanities, General Chemistry, College Level German Language, General Biology, and Western Civilization I & II. Now you'll see a new column in your Inbox with the label "Receipt Requested" that will have a Yes in it when the message has a read receipt request attached or a No if it does not.
